There are over 150 political prisoners and prisoners of war in U.S. prisons today. They come from the Puerto Rican, Black/New African, and Native American liberation movements; they include progressive Christians, white anti-imperialists, draft resisters, peace activists, animal liberationists and grand jury resisters.
